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### **Three Alliance College-Ready Public Schools Named to California Honor Roll by Educational Results Partnership and Campaign for Business and Education Excellence**

*Honor Roll for 2017-18 recognizes schools that “demonstrate high levels of student academic achievement, improvement in achievement over time, and reduction in achievement gaps”*

**May 29, 2018 (LOS ANGELES)** – Alliance-College Ready Public Schools, a non-profit public charter network serving over 13,000 scholars from across Los Angeles, announced that three of its schools have been named members of the ERP/CBEE California Honor Roll for 2017-18. These schools, **Alliance Dr. Olga Mohan High School, Alliance Marine-Innovation & Technology 6-12, and Alliance Margaret M. Bloomfield High School**, are being recognized for their consistent high levels of student academic achievement, improvement in achievement levels over time, and a reduction in achievement gaps among student populations, as well as measures of college readiness.
